Will I need more than one visit?

Usually two appointments, about a week apart.

I'm putting a rubber dam on to keep the tooth dry.

The tooth will be numb, you shouldn't feel anything.

I'm cleaning out the canals now.

We'll put a temporary filling in today.

Don't chew on that side until the tooth is finished.

The tooth may be tender for a couple of days.

After root canal treatment the tooth becomes brittle.

It will need a crown to protect it.

Is it better to save the tooth or take it out?

Come back in six months so we can check the healing on an X-ray.

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
